This position is based out of Culver City, CA, and serves the City of West Hollywood as well as other communities within the Service Planning Area (SPA) 4.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

- 1. Manage staff as direct reports, and take on supervisorial duties (such as approvals, timecards, etc)
- Supervise a team—Oversee alcohol and other drugs (AOD) and harm reduction initiatives, including research, data collection and analysis, high school and college-age youth engagement, coalition building, community organizing, and capacity building.

- 4.
