BE PREPARED!

NALOXONE (NARCAN®) SIGNS OF AN OPIOID OVERDOSE

STEP 1: EVALUATE

- UNCONSCIOUSNESS OR INABILITY TO AWAKEN
- . SLOW OR SHALLOW BREATHING
- DIFFICULTIES SUCH AS CHOCKING SOUNDS OR A GURGLING/SNORING NOISE
- FINGERNAILS OR LIPS TURNING BLUE/PURPLE
- PINPOINTED PUPILS
- . COLD OR CLAMMY SKIN

STIMULATE THE PERSON:

- . CALL THE PERSON'S NAME
- IF THIS DOES NOT WORK, VIGOROUSLY GRIND KNUCKLES INTO STERNUM OR RUB KNUCKLES ON PERSON'S UPPER LIP
- IF PERSON RESPONDS, ASSESS WHETHER HE OR SHE CAN MAINTAIN RESPONSIVENESS AND BREATHING

STEP 2: CALL 911 FOR HELP,

- ALL YOU HAVE TO SAY IS "SOMEONE IS UNRESPONSIVE AND NOT BREATHING."
- BE SURE TO GIVE SPECIFIC ADDRESS AND/OR DESCRIPTION OF YOUR LOCATION

STEP 3: ADMINISTER NALOXONE

- REMOVE NALOXONE FROM BOX, PEEL BACK TAB WITH THE CIRCLE TO OPEN, HOLD WITH YOUR THUMB ON THE BOTTOM OF PLUNGER. GENTLY INSERT TIP OF THE NOZZLE INTO EITHER NOSTRIL, PRESS PLUNGER FIRMLY
- IF PERSON OVERDOSING DOES NOT RESPOND WITHIN 2 OR 3 MINUTES, ADMINISTER A SECOND DOSE

STEP 4: SUPPORT THE PERSON'S BREATHING

- RESCUE BREATHING CAN BE VERY EFFECTIVE IN SUPPORTING RESPIRATION
- CHEST COMPRESSIONS CAN PROVIDE VENTILATORY SUPPORT

STEP 5: MONITOR THE PERSON'S RESPONSE

- MOST PEOPLE RESPOND BY RETURNING TO SPONTANEOUS BREATHING
- ESSENTIAL TO GET MEDICAL ASSISTANCE EVEN IF THE PERSON REVIVES AFTER THE INITIAL DOSE OF NALAXONE AND SEEMS TO FEEL BETTER
- NALOXONE HAS A RELATIVELY SHORT DURATION OF EFFECT, OVERDOSE SYMPTOMS MAY RETURN
