ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

- 1. Guide and participate in data collection and analysis activities, including risk assessments, environmental scans, focus groups, key stakeholder interviews, and community surveys.
- 2. Provide technical assistance to community coalitions and county-funded SUD treatment providers related to data and research.
- 3. Monitor SUD-related data dashboards and SUD-related harms in the Central Valley municipalities.
- 4. Conduct presentations and facilitate trainings for community groups and other key partners.
- 5. Assist with recruiting and facilitating youth groups to advance SUD prevention policies.
- 6. Participate in community coalition meetings and assist project staff in organizing community forums.
