- 1. Collect, analyze, and interpret data from various sources, including community surveys, environmental scans, focus groups, and key stakeholder interviews.
- 2. Provide technical assistance to community coalitions and county-funded SUD treatment providers related to data and research
- 3. Monitor SUD-related data dashboards and SUD-related harms in the Central Region municipalities
- 4. Develop and deliver presentations and training for community groups, schools, and partners.
- 5. Recruit and mentor youth leaders to support prevention and policy and systems change.
- 6. Participate in community coalition meetings and assist project staff in organizing community forums
- 7. Build and maintain strong partnerships with community leaders, policymakers, law enforcement, schools, and local agencies.
- 8. Support the development and implementation of regional strategic prevention plans.
